Red Envoy Yields Point in Dispute on German Assets

By JOHN M. HIGHTOWER

MOSCOW, March 27.—(P)—Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov agreed tonight to consider—as a basis for discussion—a French proposal to define German assets in Austria. This raised hope that the Council of Foreign Ministers might untangle this major complication in the framing of Austria's treaty. The Russians up to now have held that any German assets in the eastern zone of Austria belonged to them with-

out question, and that no definition was necessary of just what these assets were.

No decision was reached today, but there was an indication a compromise was likely on this most controversial point of the Peace Move Austrian pact.

However, Molotov submitted . compromise proposal which American authorities said unofficially they considered inacceptable. The Americans and British have insisted there must be agreement that no property would be taken from Austria as German assets which in fact had been acquired by the Germans by force or duress in annexing the na-
