Battle Flags to be Given Bay Area Reserve Units

Flags symbolic of their fighting units will be presented to 10 Army Reserve outfits in an Armistice Day ceremony at the Oakland Army Base Tuesday afternoon at 4:45 o'clock.

This ceremony is one of a nationwide series ordered by Secretary of Defense James V. Forrestal in compliment to re-activated reserve units.

Harry Bartell, chairman of the Alameda County board of supervisors, will head a civilian delegation.
