

### Four Inspectors Win Promotions

Four Oakland Police Department inspectors—picked from the top of the civil service list—will become lieutenants next Sunday, Chief Lester J. Divine announced today.

The new lieutenants are: John J. Guidici, 36, of 401 38th Street, first in the examination, who will remain as Divine's administrative assistant; Howard H. Sorrells, 44, of 3420 Wilson Avenue, who will remain in the inspectors' division; Arthur E. Simpson, 40, of 6301 Buena Ventura Avenue, who will be transferred from inspectors to the personnel and training division, and John J. Murphy, 44, of 10400 Graffian Street, from inspectors' to northern division.

Promotion of Sgt. Arthur J. McQuillan to the rank of inspector was announced simultaneously. He will remain on duty for the time being at the identification bureau.

Inspectors Leo H. Haynes and John H. Sturm, who have been acting lieutenants, are returned to the rank of inspectors. Both are on the lieutenant's eligibility list.

Sgt. Guy Skelton and Patrolman John P. Thomas Jr. are transferred from the vice squad to central division.

Other officers shifted include Lieut. Tyler Armstrong, from personnel and training to eastern; Patrolman William J. Leahy, from service to northern; Patrolman A. V. Barbeau, from service to eastern; Patrolman Lester J. Prindle, from northern to service; Patrolman M. Kittman, from central to administration, and Patrolman A. G. Hughey, from eastern to service.

### HATCHERY WORKER SENTENCED FOR FORGERY

Joseph Arthur Garwood, 31, former Castro Valley hatchery worker, has been sentenced to 5 to 14 years in San Quentin for forgery of two checks on his employer last February.

Garwood, whose home address is 126 Temple Avenue, Detroit, Mich., was arrested last month in Detroit when he applied for a job at an automobile plant. Examination of his record there revealed he was wanted in Alameda County.

When Garwood quit his hatchery job his employer discovered 15 checks had been torn out of the company book. Two of these for \$50 each subsequently were cashed at Castro Valley stores over the purported signature of the hatchery owner.
