

AFL-CIO Merger Hits Snag Over Group's Name

WASHINGTON, May 3—(AP)—AFL and CIO efforts to merge into a single labor union group have snagged at least temporarily in a dispute over a name for the proposed combined organization.

Oakland Dope Kingpin Jailed

A man the police think so d \$500,000 worth of heroin in the last 18 months was being held here today.

Matthew J. Adams, 39, of 4029 Balfour Ave. was arrested last night at the corner of 53rd and Grove Streets as he was on his way according to police, to make a narcotics delivery.

The officers, led by Lt. Arthur McQuilian, found a supply of heroin valued at \$640 concealed beneath the dashboard of the car.

Adams listed his occupation as a "speculator" and insisted that someone had placed the narcotic in his car without his knowledge.

In his expensively furnished home police said they found narcotics paraphernalia but no heroin.

Adams, who has been under surveillance for several months by local and federal narcotics agents is described by them as the biggest wholesale dealer of heroin in the Oakland area. Police estimate his sales have averaged \$1,000 a day and that he has supplied peddlers with 80 to 90 per cent of the heroin sold here.

He is held for investigation of violating narcotics laws.

Physician Fined \$5,000 on Guilty Plea

Dr. Robert L. Matteo, Oakland and Danville physician was fined \$5,000 but escaped imprisonment today on his plea of guilty to charges of issuing narcotics without a prescription.

The fine was the largest in recent years here court aides said. In passing sentence Superior Judge Chris B. Fox said that he was placing the physician on probation for five years because there were "other punishments" in the case. These he said included possible loss of the doctor's medical license. The judge ordered the \$5,000 fine paid within 30 days.

Dr. Matteo lives at 135 Esates Drive Danville and maintains offices at 1615 Broadway, Oakland. He was arrested at his offices last Dec. 17 after selling State narcotics agent Anthony Gazzola drug pills for \$180. He made two earlier sales of the drug one used by addicts to allay withdrawal sickness, for \$95 and \$110.

Dr. Matteo pleaded guilty April 11.

Formosa Denies Cease-Fire Move
