

# State 'Tops' in Crime Research

**SAN JOSE, June 23**—Dr. Paul Kirk, University of California criminologist, said California is leading the Western Hemisphere in criminological research and law enforcement.

The noted U.S. sleuth, speaking before the 40th session of the California Division of the International Assn. for Identification, described the East and Midwest as "backwards" in crime research problems.

"The Midwest and East are capable of pulling some hotshots," he continued. "I'm not going to mention any cases, however."

**DESSERT JUSTICE**

"I'd rather have justice on the Nevada desert than in some of the big centers back East. Why, there are some states that don't even have crime laboratories."

Dr. Kirk predicted that the problem of identification of criminals will become more basic in the future when new methods of positive identification are developed in the laboratory.

He referred specifically to hair and blood.

"In the laboratory we can now say that this hair or this blood did not come from this individual. But we can't yet say it did."

"That's our job. Doing of the impossible is the whole job of science," he added.

Dr. Kirk also pointed out that research currently is needed in handwriting and ballistics to be able to individualize a certain handwriting as belonging to a certain man and certain bullet as coming from one certain gun—not just a type of gun but THE gun.

**UPPER HAND**

"Lawyers currently have the upper hand in most courtroom battles with criminologists, but the situation is rapidly changing," he noted.

Deputy Police Chief Thomas J. Cahill of San Francisco also addressed the peace officers yesterday during the closing session.

"We in San Francisco definitely recognize juvenile delinquency as a problem," he said. "But all the psychology and research won't do any good if the parents don't assume their responsibility and bring their children in line. The parents are to blame."

Election of new-term officers concluded the three-day session, with Randall J. Jerabek of Long Beach chosen to succeed Arthur J. McQuillan of Oakland as president.

Other new officers are August Moister of Sacramento and Howard E. Bowman, Ventura County, vice presidents; Carl J. Wallace, Saticoy, secretary-treasurer; Dallas J. Severs, Reno, editor, and Charles W. Braun of Redding, sergeant-at-arms.

**Witness Tells**

**Political Contributions**

**SAN DIEGO, June 23**—The food and liquor concessionaire in 1954 for California's major horse race tracks has testified at the trial of Bernard P. Calhoun that he made political contributions "not too freely" on orders of "somebody from the State Board of Equalization" in 1950 and 1954.

Harry Curland, the concessionaire, and five liquor wholesalers testified yesterday for the prosecution, which is attempting to prove that Calhoun conspired to violate the state election code by soliciting such contributions from liquor dealers.

Calhoun is secretary of the Southern California Spirits Foundation, representing liquor interests.

Named with him in the county grand jury indictment is William G. Bonelli, defeated for reelection to the State Board of Equalization in 1954. He is resisting extradition from Arizona.

**National Summary**

Cooler air continued its eastward push and by early this morning reached the extreme western portion of the Great Lakes and the middle Mississippi Valley. The change to cooler was slight however, over the upper and middle Mississippi Valley and portions of the central plains as temperature falls averaged no more than 10 to 15 degrees. A warming trend was in evidence further west over the Northern Rockies and the northern plains as temperature rises in that region were as much as 15 degrees higher than the readings taken by early this morning. Elsewhere over the country temperatures changed little. One of the lowest early morning readings was 30 at Duluth, Minn., where, Calif., was one of the warmest with 82.
