

Smog Here Is Unique, Forum Told

BERKELEY, Sept. 7.—Northern California has a type of air pollution unknown in other parts of the state, Frank M. Stead, chief of the division of environmental sanitation, declared here today.

Stead spoke before a group of experts gathered at the University of California to attack the problem of smog as it affects Northern California communities.

Air pollutants in this part of the state include those thrown into the atmosphere by fish plants in the Salinas-Monterey area and by organic sewage in San Francisco Bay and in Modesto area streams, according to Stead.

In one day in Stockton recently, Stead said, 66 tons of smog were measured in the atmosphere over the city.

NEED FOR STUDY

Stead said there is a need for new research into what makes smog and what affect chemicals released in the atmosphere has on humans.

The all-day symposium, held in Earl Warren Hall, is sponsored by the Northern California section of the American Industrial Hygiene Association and the State Department of Health.

Other speakers included: Benjamin Linky, new Bay Area Air Pollution control officer.

Frank M. Stead, chief of the State Public Health division of Environmental Sanitation, presented a motion picture report of smog in the Bay Area.

Dr. Lester Breslow, chief of the State Health Department's Bureau of Chronic Diseases, "Physiological Effects of Smog on Man and Animals."
