

# Political Notes Around Eastbay

Legislation calling for stronger civil rights protection has been introduced in Congress by Rep. Jeffery Cohelan. Cohelan, who says the administration's new civil rights bill is "good, as far as it goes," said his bill will strengthen the legislation proposed by President Johnson. The proposed bill would provide for the removal of certain cases from state to federal courts, grant civil indemnification awards to persons injured while exercising their constitutional rights, extend the 1964 Civil Rights Act to state and local governments and broaden the authority of individuals or the attorney general to obtain injunctions against the violation of constitutional rights in advance rather than after the act.

funds for public relations by state and local agencies. Ed Ardzooni, candidate for the Democratic nomination in the 16th Assembly District, said today that dissatisfaction with incumbent Assemblyman Don Mulford is responsible for the fact that the 16th Assembly District now has more registered Democrats than Republicans. For the first time in a century, Ardzooni said, the Democrats have the edge by more than 1,900 voters. Republicans are leaving their party in droves, he charged, because of Mulford and his "irrational public statements which have made him an enemy of the two-party system." Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett, candidate for the Democratic nomination for governor, charged to-

day that Governor Brown is responsible for senior citizens being unable to receive a 7 per cent increase in Federal pensions. Brown, he said, failed to press for the passage of an Assembly Bill that would have provided the increase and "arrogantly disregarded" a petition signed by 32,000 aged and disabled pensioners. **130,000 Gems on Sale** TOKYO — The Japanese government will begin to sell \$20 million in diamonds at a public auction next fall. McQuillan was one of the officers who helped establish systems and procedures practices in the department. He was a graduate of Oakland Technical High School and attended the University of California. He resides with his wife, Dorothy, and children, Janet, 20; James, 18; Richard, 11; and Robert, 6, at 3542 Calafia Ave. McQuillan joined the force in April 1941. He served in Air Force intelligence as a lieutenant during World War II. He currently holds the rank of major in the Army Reserve.

He attained the police rank of sergeant in 1948, inspector in 1951 and lieutenant in 1955. He has served in the patrol, traffic and juvenile divisions as well as the identification bureau. While in the latter, he was president of the California State Division of the International Association for Identification in 1955-56.
